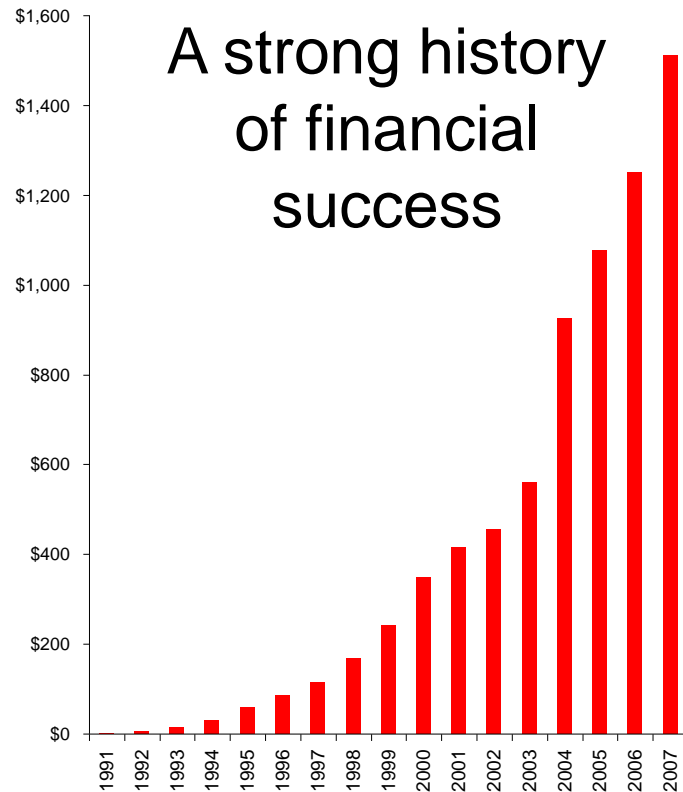

JDE Reporting Before Business Objects/Preferred Strategies

- World Writers and FASTR
 - Obvious limitations
- SEQUEL / Query 400
 - Rely more on IT for report development
 - No drill down
 - Not user friendly
 - ODBC data security concerns

JDE Reporting Before – Cont.

- Global Software - Spreadsheet Server
 - Good ad hoc financial reporting in Excel
 - Limited to certain JDE files and fields
 - Limited drill down capabilities
 - Issues with monthly financial statements in Excel changing
 - Not a company standard reporting tool with multiple data sources

JD Edwards Reporting Needs

- A more robust/flexible reporting tool that could handle our regulatory reporting
- A tool that could handle simple adhoc queries and complex drill down reports
- A secure way to give more employees access to data
- A reporting tool that could be a company standard

Reporting Needs – Cont.

- Didn't want to start from scratch writing reports
- Rely less on IT for reports/support
- Push more of the reporting out into the business

- Business Objects Edge Server
- Crystal Reports
- Web Intelligence
- Preferred Strategies BI Quick Launch



How the Solution Met the Needs:

- Business Objects Edge Server
 - An industry leader in BI solutions
 - A secure web browser interface to reports
 - Minimal IT involvement to support
- Crystal Reports
 - The ability to write a wide variety of reports (including more complex/drill down reports)
 - The same reporting tool can be used for different data sources
 - Already had some experience with Crystal

How the solution met the needs - cont:

- Web Intelligence
 - Excellent end user ad hoc reporting tool
 - Drag and drop report development environment
 - Ability to customize universe
 - Very flexible

How the solution met the needs - cont:

- Preferred Strategies BI Quick Launch
 - Crystal Report templates and samples for JDE
 - Universes defined for JDE
 - Crystal Reports training tailored to JDE
 - One on one support when you run into problems
 - Excellent support by people who are easy to work with
